He was concerned about increase traffic and the strain on infrastructure and he doesn't see it as a benefit. He is against new high-rises and agree with the moratorium.

**Sal Nicolosi**, 3607 Highway 190 West, stated he is concerned about single family housing, they are needed more than the large complexes. He stated we need single family housing.

Councilman Wells, stated his concern because district three is the only district that has land left over and what's taking place is all of the apartment complexes as well as the problems are coming into district three.

Councilman DiVittorio, stated and it affects district four as well. He also stated that he received several email that came through from people who could not attend who are in support of the moratorium.

**Spiller Milton**, 608 Susan Dr, Lakewood subdivision, he thanked the council for their support of the Lakewood Subdivision and dealing with the closing of the road and dealing with multi-housing development. He stated that they have had some sewer issues in his neighborhood. He stated they are not just interested in his subdivision but the whole town and they want to development in a planned manner. He is in favor of the moratorium and a plan that will best move Hammond forward.

He stated the amount is enough to cover about thirty-five vests but they have thirty that need to be replaced due to a mandatory policy of the replacement cycle. The cash match comes from the Hammond Police Department. The total amount will be \$36,872.50 but they will get 50% of that in grant funds if approved by Bulletproof Vest Partnership.

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement for professional services with Spangler Engineering, LLC in the amount of \$537,600 for engineering services associated with "Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Survey and Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation," which is being funded with \$6.72 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and Water Sector Program (WSP) funds. (Charles Borchers IV) **Charles Borchers,** stated they applied twice to the program and was successful in getting \$5 million through the state program for sewer rehabilitation. The plan is to take \$1.72 million American Rescue Plan Act funds which they currently have and supplement those with \$5 million in Water Sector Program Funds and be able to do \$6.72 million dollars in improvements. He stated they did an RFQ, Request for Qualifications and they had two respondents and Spangler was the highest scoring of the respondents. So they are asking the council to approve the contract with Spangler Engineering. He stated they are in a short turn around and need to provide the engineering documents to the state by August 22<sup>nd</sup> and Spangler Engineering agreed. This is just the engineering cost.

She stated the current rate is \$14.08 and that is what the customers has been charged even after the new rate was approved in the contract. They did not pass that on the customer. She stated the new rate that is being considered is increasing the \$14.08 to \$20.48 which would be a \$6.40 increase that will be eliminating the single point of recycling at Highway 190. If the single point of recycling at Highway 190 is included then the total new rate would be \$20.98 which is an increase of \$6.90. In comparison she gave an overview of the cost of garbage pick-up in other cities. She stated that garbage costs have escalated everywhere.

Councilman Wells enters the meeting

Councilwoman Gonzales, asked about the cost to the city and stated it would need to be in the new budget.

**Lacy Landrum,** stated if the city covers the increase of the cost it is probably around \$400,000 to \$500,000, depending on which month and how many customers they have for that month.

Councilman Wells, asked about the estimate of the cost to the city as of today to the end of the year. Lacy Landrum stated that is a rough estimate because the cost is based on per customer per month. Councilman Wells asked for a rough estimate of how much the city has paid on the contract this for since the day it was signed up to today.

Lacy Landrum stated that she would have to go back and look at what date that was, but she could get that information for him.

Councilman Wells asked about the rates of the surrounding cities e.g. Ponchatoula, He would like comparisons done around the city.

**Sal Nicolosi**, 3607 Highway 190 West, stated he is concerned about the cost and stated that he was against an increase. He asked the council to consider the people on fixed incomes and are not wealthy. **Tracey Washington Wells**, 610 Mooney Ave, stated in speaking for District Three the increase may not be a lot for some but in her district seven dollars is a lot and should not be passed on to the citizens. She asked that the council consider their constituents.
