Jill Dangerfield, 1000 Rue De La Paix, would like to have an answer and hope that it doesn’t take a long time or happens again.

Trae Welch, raised questions about a hanger at the airport. He stated they needed an occupancy permit and talked about the issues they were having.

Cindy Grego, asked about the inspection at the property in Villa West.

Charles Borchers, talked about the current state of the building department and asked that they be given time.

Councilman Andrews, stated that people are looking for them to do something.

Deborah Swenson, 210 Ravenwood, asked if the person doing the repairs been given a hard deadline and she thinks there should be an investigation.

Frank Divittorio, asked about the airport board and he stated that they need to get control of the board and there are reasons to investigate.

Councilwoman Gonzales, spoke about the resolutions and thought it was too broad. She raised questions regarding the item and suggested changes.

Stanley Campbell, 8 Fariway View Court, spoke about retaliation and stated that the city has a process problem. He asked the city attorney a hypothetical question on how the ordinance violation process works and equal treatment.

City Attorney Coudrain, stated that there would be equal treatment if it was the same situation.

Frank DiVittorio, stated that policies should be looked at and reviewed.

Christine Monistere, 208 Camelia Ave, asked about a prior incident and investigation of the police department.

Sal Nicolosi, 3607 Hwy 190 west, asked that the resolution be passed and that they bring someone from the outside in.

Tracy Washington Wells, thanked Councilman DiVittorio for putting the resolution together and stated that this is a systemic problem in the administrations policies and procedures and there is a need to be put in place for accountability. She expects her council person to vote in favor.

Councilman Steve Leon, stated the process is going to be drawn out and he would like to see Villa West situation resolved immediately and there needs to be a statement from the city on what has happened.

Councilman DiVittorio, stated that these are two separate items, Villa West is getting done. The scope of investigation is going to be taking care of a lot of issues throughout the building permit office. He requested documentation of when the Villa West issue would be resolved.

Cindy Grego, talked about the property in Villa West and she stated that there needs to be a time limit and accountability.

Councilman Steve Leon, stated that money should be spent on policies and procedures and not an investigation. He would like to see a consultant firm coming in to develop policies and procedures to keep us moving forward.

Renee Washington, 402 Washington Ave, stated that an investigation needs to be done and people need to be held accountable.

Jan Lobue, asked about policies and procedures.

Councilman Wells, stated they do not know where the city stands with the money because they have never received a financial report.

Councilman DiVittorio, stated they have never received a financial report that that voted on over two years ago.

Jim Grego, 1108 Rue Chalet, asked about quarterly reports and making the city accountable.

Councilwoman Gonzales, stated that if they wanted to pass the item tonight she has four recommendations and she explained them.

Councilman DiVittorio, explained the scope and the goal of the resolution. He doesn't think anything needs to be changed.

There was a motion by **Councilman Wells** and a second by **Councilman DiVittorio** to approve a resolution of the Hammond City Council providing a scope for its investigation of the building department and for incidental matters.

City Attorney Coudrain, stated that the motion required four votes under the Charter to pass. It takes 2/3 votes for an investigation scope there were three in favor and two opposed. Under the Charter it takes 2/3 which would be four votes to approve the scope of the investigation.

Councilman DiVittorio, stated that this is a resolution and it's a scope that will move forward into an investigation when it's engaged.

City Attorney Coudrain, stated that the Charter requires that you have a specific purpose in the investigation.

Stanley Campbell, 8 Fariway View Court, he asked the council if they give their opinion or are they representing their constituents .

Councilwoman Gonzales, stated she represents her constituents and she talks to people about the issues.

Mike Barnholdt, state that you can't investigate yourself. He suggest the first an foremost investigator should be an outsider with the council having some input.

Tracey Washington Wells, asked about a previous vote and the why this time require four votes.

City Attorney Coudrain, explained how the Charter reads.

Tracey Washington Wells, read from a resolution dated August 27th. She stated that the council should seek another opinion and she is challenging the decision.

City Attorney Coudrain, stated he is happy to request an opinion from the attorney general.

Councilman DiVittorio, asked about hiring an attorney to get an opinion.
