Mike Barnholdt, stated they need to be able to trust city officials. He thinks there is two kitchens in the house. He stated the secrecy needs to stop.

Councilman DiVittorio, ask to have that information verified that work was done.

Michelle Kendall, asked about plans for the building department.

Mayor, stated that Dana Brown is under contract and Robert Morgan is under contract and they are currently interviewing for grants.

Councilman Wells Called Ms. Pam Haynes up.

Pam Haynes, asked about the status pf the postal delivery issue and asked for an update.

Andre Coudrain, City Attorney, provided an update on what he has done.

Pam Haynes, stated they need results, her community is older and they don't need to go to the road to get they mail. They need help.

Councilman Wells, called up Ms. Wagner-Jones

Ms Victoria Wagner Jones, stated she was 82 and this has been an incovience for her to go out to the road to get her mail.

Shaun Corbin, 114 Maryland St, she stated that packages can be brought to the door by the postal service but the mail can't. She stated that if there is a dog issue, how can they bring packages to the door and drop them off but not put the mail in the box on the house.

Councilman Wells stated that the dog was on Carolina St., He stated another City Councilman had the same issue and they passed an ordinance that all dogs are to be on a leash. He expressed his concern and regarding contacting the post office. He stated someone at the post office told one of his contituents that they are doing this throughout the whole city. If that is the case there's nothing he can say, but he would like to know if anyone else is getting these notices like District 3. He also expressed a concern about the people calling out their address because of the drug problem in the communities.

Councilman DiVittorio, spoke about the leash law. He asked Charles Borchers to send the leash law ordinance to Hammond Police Department.

Councilman Wells stated they received two letters from the postal service and they are being forced to get a mailbox and he wants to see everyone treated the same.

There was a motion by <u>Councilman DiVittorio</u> and second by <u>Councilman Andrews</u> to approve a resolution of the Hammond City Council regarding Postal Delivery.

Charles Borchers, explained the item. He stated they applied several months back and were awarded the grant. There is no cash match the matche comes from volunteers with Keep Hammond Beautiful.

Tom Pistorius, architect of record, $109\frac{1}{2}$ W Thomas St, he stated they had a bid opening in the chamber on September 6 and they had 10 bidders that showed up and submitted bides. The lowest responsible bidder was Kelly Construction Group for \$774,900 and it is within budget. He recommended they be awarded the bid.

Councilman Kip Andrews stated that he received an email from Mr. Tom Hogan and he asked that it be a part of the record.

There was a motion by <u>Councilman Leon</u> and second by <u>Councilwoman Gonzales</u> to ratify bids for "The Pavillion" and to award a contract in the amount of \$774,900 to the lowest responsible bidder, Kelly Construction Group.

Mayor Panepinto, state this was the contract to repair the rail spur out by the airport and he explained the item.

Councilman Wells asked about getting the tracks fixed at the Holly St crossing. Mayor stated he would look into it.

There was a motion by <u>Councilman Andrews</u> and second by <u>Councilwoman Gonzales</u> to approve the Mayor to enter into contract with Pointer Smith Contracting, for Railroad Track Repairs in the amount of \$54,650.00.
